 MS-5 Creating a Collaborative Field Study with ArcGIS Online (Angela Alexander - Esri Canada)

In this hands-on session, teachers will learn how to create a collaborative field study using an interactive survey tool in ArcGIS Online. We recommend that you bring a smartphone or tablet to this session.

2. MS-22 ArcGIS online, Learning the Basics of Digital Mapping (Pat Adams and Rod Epp - MapToLearn and Manitoba Education)

In this hands-on workshop learn the basics of Esri's ArcGIS online digital mapping tool, creating maps that can be used for inquiry and analysis. This workshop is designed for teachers new to digital mapping and those with some experience wishing to review and practice their mapping skills.

3. MS-26 Storytelling with Story Maps (Angela Alexander - Esri Canada)

Story Maps let you combine authoritative maps with narrative text, images, and multimedia content. They make it easy to harness the power of maps and geography to tell your story. In this session, you will learn how to build your own story map and leave with the resources you need for students to build story maps, too.

4. MS-30 Creating Story Maps Online (Pat Adams and Rod Epp - MapToLearn and Manitoba Education)

Using ArcGIS online, a web based mapping tool by Esri, participants will create a map and then use the map to build a Story Map. As all Manitoba teachers and students can hold accounts with Esri, this workshop will provide first time users with a hands on opportunity to learn the basic skills and explore the galleries of maps and Story Maps.
